

Join "Save the Delta" to

Stop Governor Schwarzenegger's Peripheral Canal and Water Grab !!!

***The water legislation/bills currently in the California State
Legislature are objectionable and will unduly authorize . . .***

- Construction of a superfluous peripheral canal which will cost taxpayers (i.e. "beneficiaries") \$20 - \$30 billion at a time when California is in economic crisis and struggling to resolve a \$24 billion shortfall.
- Private control of the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta through an exclusive five-member Delta "governance" board appointed by Governor Schwarzenegger. This will include 66% of California's water supply and major portions of California's agricultural industry, and will be achieved without the approval or vote of the citizens of California.
- Implementation of the flawed Delta Vision Strategic Plan, whose dogma will dictate the administration and future of the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta. The published Delta Vision recognizes many of its projections and suppositions are inconclusive at best, stating "there is not sufficient information" and "specific information . . . is still incomplete" regarding many elements of the proposed goals.
- Further degradation and erosion of the Delta's ecological and environmental resources through increased water salinization resulting in additional decline and possible extinction of Delta smelt and American River spawning salmon among other endangered fish species.
- Diversion of most of the Sacramento River water above the Delta, which will result in the destruction of prime Delta agricultural land from major saltwater intrusion and the creation of saltwater marshes just below Sacramento (similar to Highway 37 between Vallejo and San Rafael).
- Redirecting precious fresh water resources from prime agricultural land in the northern Delta to water-intensive and toxic desert agricultural regions in the Central Valley, thus further compromising California's access to available fresh water and decreasing food availability while increasing food prices. (The Delta and Sacramento Valley are considered as prime areas in the food shed of both Sacramento and the Bay Area.)
- Confiscation of agricultural land and water rights from long-time Delta residents and farmers through eminent domain. A number of these families are seventh generation Californians and among California's earliest settlers.

Background

In an apparent attempt to control California's primary source of water and destroy rich agricultural land in the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta, Senator Darrell Steinberg is currently spearheading the creation of legislation which will authorize the implementation of the Delta Vision Strategic Plan and subsequently permit the construction of a peripheral canal, handing over 66% of Californians' water to the private sector. This legislation is being rushed through the California legislature with the initial legislative hearing on Tuesday, July 7 at 10 a.m., at the State Capitol, Room 4202, and may be voted on by the full legislature as early as mid-to-late July. Honorable Governor Schwarzenegger/Senator/Assemblyman/ _____:

As a resident of California, I am deeply concerned about the current attempt to enact legislation recognizing the Delta Vision Strategic Plan (DVSP) as the ultimate authority for deciding the future of the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta. Not only would adoption of the DVSP allow the creation of a "governance" body, which would place the control of the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta, California's largest water system, into the hands of only a handful of individuals, but it would also do so arbitrarily and without the consent of the citizens of California.

Additionally, adoption of the DVSP would result in the building of a peripheral canal – a proposal Californians overwhelmingly rejected at the polls in 1982 – and would subject the public to extraordinary taxes and/or increases in water fees to pay the onerous \$20 - \$30 billion construction costs – and at a time when California is in the middle of its worst economic crisis and already struggling to resolve a \$24 billion deficit.

The DVSP's goals are also very vague and lacking in specific details and the Blue Ribbon Task Force's Vision for the California Delta recognizes that data to support many of the recommendations addressed in the DVSP is inconclusive at best, stating "there is not sufficient information" to guarantee outcomes and that "specific information about water quality, costs, seismic risk, or meeting species protection laws is still incomplete."

It is essential that the decisions and processes for creating future management of the Delta are transparent, not rushed, and brought to a vote before the people of California. I strongly encourage you to oppose any legislation which will recognize or give Delta governance authority to an appointed governance board or allow implementation of the Delta Vision Strategic Plan.
